

Letter of Introduction

Directions: Write me a friendly letter that will give me some information about who you are and what I can help you with in terms of math. Try to limit your response to one page. This letter is to be written in paragraph form, not in lists of responses. You should use complete sentences and ideas, and check for grammar and punctuation. Remember to address the letter to me.

Your letter needs to address the following topics in a separate paragraph:

- ◆ Introduce yourself to me. Tell me about your hobbies and your interests. Do you work? Are you or do you plan to be involved in activities at Centennial? What are your plans for after graduation?
- ◆ Describe what makes a good math teacher good. Also describe any high school teachers—from any content area—who have impressed you, and why those teachers were impressive.
- ◆ Describe how you feel about taking an honors math class. Is this your first honors math class? Are you nervous about the content? Before looking at any textbook, what kinds of topics do you imagine this course to include?
- ◆ Do you consider yourself a good math student? Why or why not? What makes a good math student? What grade would you like to earn in this class, and what will you do to earn it?
